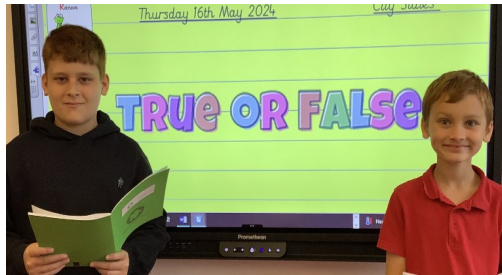


Year 6 have competed their SATs! We are so proud of how hard they have worked all year leading up to this. They have had a film day today (with plenty of treats) to celebrate.
