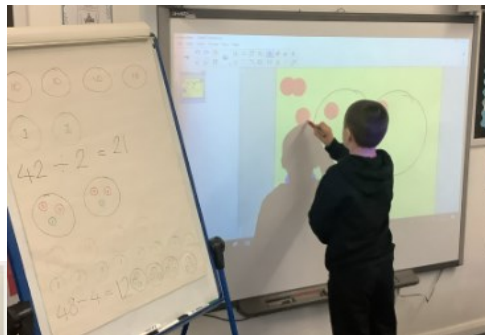

On Thursday we had a fantastic time celebrating World Book Day. We started the day by showing off the costumes worn by children and staff across school in a playground parade. Harry Potter, Alice in Wonderland, Spiderman and many more were all spotted here at Doxey Primary!

Back in their classrooms, children completed a range of activities linked to a love of books and reading. This included everyone producing some incredible art work, which will soon be displayed in our new library. Each year group discovered a very exciting gift wrapped and waiting for them in the library. A bundle of brand new books to fill their reading corners with stories to explore.

Year 4 have been doing lots of work on division. Mrs Williams modelled how to divide using the grouping method first then the children used counters to do the same.
